Dear St. Rita Family,

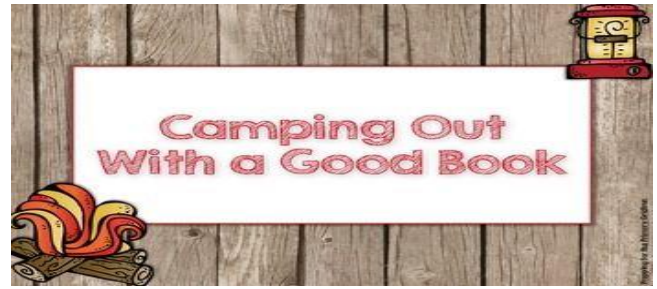

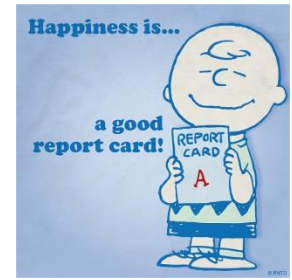
As Catholics, we start the month on Nov. 1st by celebrating the feast of All Saint's Day. This is a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics. This year it will be on Wednesday and the children will attend the All School Mass. We will not have mass on Tuesday, Oct. 31st.

Parents and family are always welcome to attend our school masses. As Catholics, we are expected to attend mass each week end and on the Holy Days of Obligation. On November 2nd, we remember those we have loved and who have died on the Feast of All Souls Day. It is also celebrated as Día de los Muertos in many of the Latin cultures.

One way to honor those people is to offer a mass for them. Our school mass intentions are a good time for you to remember and pray for family members.
